


Number of Patients Waiting vs. Number of Organ Donors

Despite a slight increase in the number of deceased donors, living donation has been declining. Sadly, the number of donors cannot eve come close to meeting the needs of the growing kidney waiting list



Waiting Time for Deceased Donor Kidney:

Up to 6 to 10 yrs in New York



The slight increase in deceased donation may be due to the novel strategies used by transplant centers like ours to increase opportunities for transplantation, including utilization of:

- High KDPI kidneys
- Small pediatric kidneys
- Hepatitis C positive kidneys
- PHS Increased Risk kidneys
- HIV positive kidneys


